Dear Mr. Assistant Attorney General:

I have the honor to refer to the Procedures for Mutual Assistance in Administration of Justice in connection with the Lockheed Aircraft Corporation Matter signed in Washington on March 23, 1976.<sup>2</sup> I have further the honor to propose, on behalf of the Ministry of Justice of Japan, that the operation of the aforementioned Procedures be extended, by the exchange of this letter and your affirmative reply thereto, to include alleged illicit acts pertaining to the activities in Japan of the McDonnell Douglas Corporation and the Grumman Corporation and their subsidiaries and affiliates, and that such extension become effective on the date of your affirmative reply.

In the case of such extension, the Ministry of Justice of Japan and the Department of Justice of the United States of America will exchange information relating to the McDonnell Douglas Corporation and the Grumman Corporation matters under the same terms and conditions as those contained in the aforementioned Procedures.
