AGREEMENT' BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF FINLAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE SOCIALIST FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF YUGOSLAVIA ON COOPERATION IN THE FIELD OF TOURISM

The Government of the Republic of Finland and the Government of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia,

Desiring to develop and strengthen the friendly relations between the two countries and to promote cooperation in the field of tourism,

Have agreed as follows:

Article 1. The Contracting Parties will promote and support cooperation in the field of tourism, as well as in other related fields.

For this purpose, the Contracting Parties will, within their competence, take measures to promote and increase tourist traffic between the two countries and encourage and support the cooperation between the tourist and other related organizations in the two countries.

- Article 2. The Contracting Parties will exchange programmes, professional publications, research material, statistic and other relevant information as well as experience in the field of tourism.
- Article 3. The representatives of the Contracting Parties shall hold meetings to consider the results achieved in the cooperation and suggest measures for the implementation of this Agreement.

These meetings shall be held on the proposal of one of the Contracting Parties at the place and the time the two Parties will agree upon.

- Article 4. This Agreement shall enter into force thirty days after the Contracting Parties have notified each other that the constitutional requirements for the entry into force of this Agreement have been complied with.
- Article 5. This Agreement shall remain in force for a period of five years. It shall thereafter be tacitly renewed for successive periods of one year unless denounced in writing through diplomatic channels by either Contracting Party six months before the expiry of any one period.
