CONVENTION¹ CONCERNING THE DEMARCATION OF THE STATE FRONTIER BETWEEN THE PEOPLE'S DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF ALGERIA AND THE ISLAMIC REPUBLIC OF MAURITANIA

The People's Democratic Republic of Algeria and

The Islamic Republic of Mauritania,

Considering the close geographical, historical, economic, cultural and social links which have always existed between the people of the People's Democratic Republic of Algeria and the people of the Islamic Republic of Mauritania and the awareness of their common destiny in the context of the Greater Arab Maghreb,

Desiring to consolidate the fraternal and good-neighbourly relations between the two countries and to promote the closest and most fruitful co-operation between them in all fields.

Seeking to promote the building of the Greater Arab Maghreb by consolidating the fraternal relations which exist between the States and peoples of the Maghreb and by developing their relations in a harmonious and continuous manner,

Determined to work for the maintenance of justice, peace and security in the world and to unite their efforts with a view to ensuring respect for and the application of the principles set forth in the Charters of the United Nations and the Organization of African Unity,<sup>2</sup>

Convinced that the demarcation of the common frontier between the two States, in accordance with the principle of the inviolability of frontiers inherited at independence, as set forth in resolution AHG/Res.16 of the Organization of African Unity, which states that "all Member States pledge themselves to respect the borders existing on their achievement of national independence", constitutes an appropriate means of achieving these objectives,

Have agreed as follows:

Article 1. The State frontier between the Islamic Republic of Mauritania and the People's Democratic Republic of Algeria, as inherited at the accession to independence of each of the two countries, shall be represented by a straight line, the extreme eastern point of which is situated at geographic co-ordinates:

- Longitude: 4°50'00.0" West of the international meridian
- Latitude: 25°00'00.0" North

and which passes through the well known as "Hassi 75", jointly recognized by the two Parties, and ends at an extreme western point on longitude line 8°40′00.0", each of these three points being demarcated by a frontier mark.

Article 2. The demarcation operations shall be supervised by the Algerian-Mauritanian Mixed Frontier Demarcation Commission. A Mixed Technical Group, to be appointed by this Commission, shall conduct the demarcation operations, which shall be completed by 1 March 1984.

For the purpose of carrying out the demarcation operations, the Mixed Technical Group shall determine the geographic co-ordinates of the well known as "Hassi 75" and the latitude of the extreme western point.

The High Contracting Parties may decide, if necessary, to jointly erect additional frontier marks in accordance with the frontier line and the provisions of this Convention.

The demarcation operations shall be concluded by means of a record initialled and signed by the Co-Chairmen of the Algerian-Mauritanian Mixed Frontier Demarcation Commission.

- Article 3. The following documents shall be annexed to this Convention, of which they shall form an integral part:
- 1. The record of the conclusion of the demarcation operations;
- 2. The record cards of the frontier marks with their geographic co-ordinates;
- 3. The available 1:1,000,000 and 1:200,000 scale maps showing the frontier marks and the frontier line;
- 4. The list of co-ordinates of the frontier marks indicating the frontier between the two States:
- 5. The list of geographic co-ordinates indicating the course of the frontier at intervals of five minutes.
- Article 4. The file of all preparatory operations for the demarcation of the common frontier of the two States shall be deposited, duly stamped and initialled, with the cartographic authority of each of the two countries.
- Article 5. The High Contracting Parties shall draw up joint maps on the scales 1:200,000 and 1:1,000,000 indicating the location of the frontier marks.

The maps drawn up in accordance with the provisions of the preceding paragraph of this article and the co-ordinates of the frontier marks shall henceforth serve as a reference for any cartographic activity.

- Article 6. The land frontier as defined by the frontier marks under this Convention shall also delimit vertically the airspace between the two States as well as rights to the subsoil.
- Article 7. The High Contracting Parties may, if they deem it necessary, undertake inspection of the frontier marks, either jointly or separately, for the purpose of ascertaining that they are in good condition.

In the event of the destruction, displacement or disappearance of one or more frontier marks, the Contracting Parties shall jointly replace or reconstruct them in accordance with the geographic co-ordinates specified for the said frontier marks in this Convention.

Article 8. The High Contracting Parties shall be jointly responsible for defraying the costs of maintaining the frontier marks.

- Article 9. The High Contracting Parties shall take all necessary steps to protect the frontier marks. They may also prosecute any individual who has damaged, destroyed or displaced the said frontier marks.
- Article 10. The High Contracting Parties undertake to respect the inviolability of the common frontier of the two States.
- Article 11. This Convention shall be subject to ratification in accordance with the procedures in force in each of the two States.
- Article 12. This Convention shall be registered with the Secretariat of the United Nations by the Contracting Parties or by either one of those Parties, in accordance with Article 102 of the Charter of the United Nations.

This Convention is drawn up in two original copies in the Arabic and French languages, both texts being equally authentic.




























