AGREEMENT¹ ON CO-OPERATION BETWEEN THE COUNCIL FOR MUTUAL ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE AND THE UNITED NATIONS INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT ORGANIZATION

The Council for Mutual Economic Assistance, hereinafter referred to as CMEA, and the United Nations Industrial Development Organization, hereinafter referred to as UNIDO,

Guided by a desire to further, on the basis of equality and mutual advantage, co-operation between the member States of both organizations in matters relating to industrialization,

Proceeding from the fact that the member countries of CMEA support the legitimate aspiration of the developing countries to achieve and consolidate their political independence and economic self-reliance, and are developing mutually advantageous economic, scientific and technical co-operation with them,

Intending to assist in the restructuring of international economic relations and the establishment of a new international economic order on a just and democratic basis, with due allowance for the importance of industrial development and co-operation in the attainment of these goals, in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Declaration and Programme of Action on the Establishment of a New International Economic Order, adopted by the General Assembly of the United Nations in its resolutions 3201 (S-VI)² and 3202 (S-VI)³ of 1 May 1974, the Charter of Economic Rights and Duties of States (resolution 3281 (XXIX) of 12 December 1974)⁴ and the Lima Declaration and Plan of Action, adopted by the Second General Conference of UNIDO in March 1975,⁵

Taking into account the experience within CMEA in achieving economic, scientific and technical co-operation and in developing the socialist economic integration of the member countries of CMEA which can be used by the developing countries and by UNIDO, and also the experience of UNIDO's activities which can be used by CMEA,

Bearing in mind the favourable results of co-operation between CMEA and UNIDO which have been achieved thus far,

Convinced that co-operation between them will contribute to the social and economic development and the speedier industrialization of the developing countries,

Desiring to expand still further co-operation between them on the basis of the provisions of documents defining the respective mandates of CMEA and UNIDO,

In an endeavour to establish a general framework for and possible forms of co-operation between CMEA and UNIDO in areas of interest to both organizations,

Have agreed as follows:

Article I. CMEA and UNIDO, in accordance with the objectives set forth in the Charter of CMEA and the constituent documents of UNIDO, and taking into account the fact that industrialization is the motive force of rapid economic and social development, will co-operate extensively in problems of mutual interest in the area of industrial development, including problems relating to assistance in the industrialization of the developing countries.

Article II. The co-operation provided for in Article I of this Agreement shall be achieved through:

- The exchange of information, methodological, normative and other materials relating to the activities of CMEA and UNIDO in specific areas of industrial development;
- Participation, by mutual agreement between CMEA and UNIDO, of experts from both organizations as observers at meetings and other activities organized by these organizations;
- Participation, by mutual agreement between CMEA and UNIDO, of experts from the CMEA Secretariat as speakers at symposia, seminars, training programmes and similar activities organized by UNIDO, including special seminars for representatives of developing countries, in order to acquaint them with the experience of CMEA in the area of industrial co-operation;
- Consultations, particularly on questions relating to the development by CMEA and UNIDO of research on problems coming within the sphere of activity of the other organization;
- Co-operation in the preparation of joint studies and the implementation of projects connected with the solution of the industrial development problems of the developing countries;
- Transfer of the experience of CMEA member countries in the fields of planning, and of those countries' experience of economic management and planning.

Article III. The co-operation to be organized in accordance with this Agreement shall be based on the principles and procedures of CMEA and UNIDO and shall be effected within the limits of their competence and in accordance with their normative documents.

Article IV. In order to ensure effective co-operation between CMEA and UNIDO, the Parties shall, by mutual agreement, prepare working programmes of co-operation and shall hold joint consultations at regular intervals, alternately at CMEA Headquarters and UNIDO Headquarters, for the purpose of carrying out these programmes.

Article V. Each Party shall itself defray all costs resulting from its participation in the implementation of this Agreement, including those connected with the assignment of its representatives to activities carried out by the other Party. If any form of co-operation is associated with substantial expenditure by the Party complying with the request, the representatives of CMEA and UNIDO shall determine the procedure for meeting such expenditures.

Article VI. Any amendments and additions to this Agreement may be made by mutual agreement between CMEA and UNIDO.

Article VII. Either of the Parties may denounce this Agreement by giving six months' notice in writing to the other Party.

Article VIII. This Agreement shall enter into force on the date of its signature by the Secretary of CMEA and the Executive Director of UNIDO.
