

AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE FRENCH REPUBLIC AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND RELATING TO THE DELIMITATION OF THE TERRITORIAL SEA IN THE STRAITS OF DOVER

The Government of the French Republic and the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland;

Considering that the boundary delimiting the parts of the continental shelf appertaining to France and the United Kingdom, respectively, in the area east of 30 minutes west of the Greenwich Meridian has been defined by the Agreement between the two Governments signed at London on 24 June 1982;²

Desiring to establish a part of that boundary as the limit between the territorial sea of the French Republic and that of the United Kingdom in the Straits of Dover;

Have agreed as follows:

Article 1

1. The boundary between the territorial sea of the French Republic and the territorial sea of the United Kingdom shall be a line composed of loxodromes joining in the sequence given the points defined as follows by means of their coordinates:

2. The positions of points I to VI in paragraph 1 are defined on European Datum (1st Adjustment 1950).

3. The boundary line defined in paragraph 1 has been drawn solely by way of illustration on the chart³ annexed to this Agreement.

Article 2

Points I and VI as defined above shall be the new final points of the boundaries delimiting the parts of the continental shelf appertaining respectively to France and to the United Kingdom in the area east of 30 minutes west of the Greenwich Meridian.

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These boundaries are composed of loxodromes joining:

a) Points 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, and I, and

b) Points VI, 12, 13 and 14,

as defined by the Agreement of 24 June 1982 and by this Agreement.

Article 3

Each Contracting Party shall notify the other of the completion of the constitutional procedures required for the entry into force of this Agreement. The Agreement shall enter into force on the date when the last notification is received.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the undersigned, duly authorised thereto by their respective Governments, have signed this Agreement.

DONE in duplicate at Paris this 2nd day of November 1988, in the French and English languages, both texts being equally authoritative.

JOINT DECLARATION BY THE GOVERNMENT OF THE FRENCH REPUBLIC AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM

On the occasion of the signing of the Agreement relating to the Delimitation of the Territorial Sea in the Straits of Dover, the two Governments have agreed on the following Declaration.

The existence of a specific navigation regime in straits is generally accepted in international law in its current state. The need for such a regime is particularly evident in straits such as the Straits of Dover which are used for international navigation and which connect two parts of the high seas or two economic zones where no other route of similar convenience exists with respect to navigational characteristics.

The two Governments therefore recognize the right of unimpeded transit passage through the Straits of Dover of merchant ships, government ships and especially warships in their normal mode of navigation, and also the right of overflight by aircraft. It is understood that, in conformity with the principles governing this regime and the rules of international law, such passage shall be continuous and expeditious.

The two Governments shall continue to cooperate closely both on a bilateral basis and through the International Maritime Organization, in order to ensure the safety of navigation in the Straits of Dover, the southern part of the North Sea and the English Channel. In particular, the traffic separation scheme in the Straits of Dover shall not be affected by the entry into force of the Agreement.

The two Governments shall also, in conformity with international agreements currently in force and generally accepted rules and standards, and taking due note of the interests of the coastal States, take the necessary measures to prevent, reduce and control pollution of the marine environment by ships.

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
