The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Macedonia presents its compliments to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Latvia and has the honour to inform that Macedonian side agrees with the proposal of the Republic of Latvia expressed in its note No. 43/7366-8841 dated October 4, 2006

"to exempt the holders of the Diplomatic Passports of the Republic of Macedonia from the visa requirement. The citizens of the Republic of Macedonia who are the holders of the Diplomatic Passports are proposed to enter the territory of the Republic of Latvia and stay there for a period not exceeding ninety days in any half-year from the date of first entry."

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Macedonia considers that the note of the Ministry of the Republic of Latvia No. 43/7366-8841 and this note in reply shall constitute the Agreement for exemption from the visa requirement of the holders of the Diplomatic Passports of the Republic of Macedonia, which shall enter into force on the date of the receipt of the latter diplomatic note by which Parties notify each other about the completion of the internal procedures.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Macedonia avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Latvia the assurances of its highest consideration.
