TECHNICAL AGREEMENT (TA)

BETWEEN THE MINISTRY OF DEFENCE OF THE REPUBLIC OF BULGARIA, THE MINISTRY OF DEFENCE OF THE REPUBLIC OF CYPRUS, THE MINISTRY OF NATIONAL DEFENCE OF THE HELLENIC REPUBLIC AND THE MINISTRY OF DEFENCE OF ROMANIA ON THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN EU MULTINATIONAL BATTLEGROUP WITH GREECE AS FRAMEWORK NATION AND THE PARTICIPATION OF BULGARIA, CYPRUS AND ROMANIA

PREAMBLE

The Ministry of Defence of the Republic of Bulgaria (MOD-BU), the Ministry of Defence of the Republic of Cyprus (MOD-CY), the Ministry of National Defence of the Hellenic Republic (MOD-GR) and the Ministry of Defence of Romania (MOD-RO)

- Considering that the fundamental framework for international relations is the United Nations and that the United Nations Security Council has the primary responsibility for the maintenance of international peace and security;
- Noting the Letter of Intent (hereinafter referred to as "the LOI") concerning the establishment of an EU Multinational BattleGroup with Greece as Framework Nation (hereinafter referred to as "the FN") and the participation of Bulgaria, Cyprus and Romania (hereinafter referred to as Participants), signed by MOD-BU, MOD-CY, MOD-GR and MOD-RO in Brussels on the 21st of November 2005;
- Recognizing that, in the field of crisis management, the common objective of the Member States of the European Union is to develop their military capabilities, in order to strengthen the military capabilities of the European Union.
- Noting that the implementation of the EU BG Concept is one of the key elements in the process of reinforcing the EU's capabilities for effective crisis management and especially the rapid response capabilities.
- Considering the status of the Member States/ Nations participating in that Battlegroup with regard to the EU structures.
- Noting that up to the date of Bulgaria's and Romania's accession to the EU, the Agreement between the Republic of Bulgaria and the EU establishing a framework for the participation of the Republic of Bulgaria in the EU crisis management operations, done in Brussels on 24 January 2005 and the Agreement between the EU and Romania establishing a framework for the participation of Romania in the EU crisis management operations, done in Brussels on 22 November 2004 will apply, respectively.
- Having, as a priority matter, the development of European Union military rapid response capability, as stated in the European Security Strategy;
- Taking into account that, with the Headline Goal 2010 document, EU member States have stated their commitment to fulfill the requirement in responding to the whole spectrum of crisis management operations covered by the Treaty on the European Union;
- Confirming the willingness, expressed by MOD-GR to organize a Multinational BattleGroup, and by MOD-BU, by MOD-CY and by MOD-RO, to join this Multinational Hellenic-based EU BattleGroup (hereinafter referred as "the HELBROC BG");

hereby agree, as follows:

SECTION 1

DEFINITIONS

1.1 For the purposes of this Technical Agreement (TA) and subsequent documents, specific definitions will apply as shown in attached Annex "A" of this TA.

SECTION 2

PURPOSE OF THE TA

2.1 The purpose of this TA is to provide a framework document that defines the general conditions of forming the "HELBROC BG" with Greece as the Framework Nation (FN) and the participation of Bulgaria, Cyprus and Romania.

2.2 The provisions of this TA will be applied to all personnel/ units that the Participants will decide to earmark for the "HELBROC BG".

2.3 This TA applies, if not otherwise specified, to all "HELBROC BG" activities. If one or more Participants do not take part in given "HELBROC BG" activities, this TA will apply between the remaining Participants.

SECTION 3

PURPOSE OF THE HELBROC BG

3.1 The purpose of the "HELBROC BG" is to contribute to the strengthening and further development of the European Security and Defence Policy, by making it available to the EU for the undertaking of EU-led Crisis Management Operations.

SECTION 4

FORCE CONTRIBUTION, COMMAND STRUCTURE AND STAFF

4.1 The "HELBROC BG" package will consist of a Force Headquarters (FHQ), based on the assigned Brigade, of a reinforced Battalion associated with the necessary Combat Support and Combat Service Support elements, as well as the appropriate air and maritime enablers.

4.2 When the "HELBROC BG" is activated, according to an EU Council's decision for a specific Crisis Management Operation, it will be deployed under the Operational Command of the Hellenic OHQ.

4.3 Transfer of Authority (TOA) to the Operation Commander will take place upon arrival of the forces in the assembly area.

4.4 Greece will offer positions in the OHQ/ FHQ and Battalion HQ to the other Participants, in accordance with the entity of the capabilities/personnel that they effectively contribute to the "HELBROC BG" while preserving the cohesiveness of the military package.

4.5 The respective units which shall be incorporated in the composition of the "HELBROC BG" will remain at their permanent homebase stations and under the national command structure, having the appropriate readiness to deploy.

4.6 The generic "HELBROC BG" structure, the respective BG' composition and the multinationally allocated posts of the FHQ, are specified at Annex "B" of this TA. Any changes regarding the above contributions/commitments can be made only after proper consultation with the FN without being necessary to amend or revise this TA in accordance with the procedure provided for in Section 14, para 14.2 thereof.

SECTION 5
PERSONNEL

5.1 The job descriptions of the positions referred to in para 4.4 of this TA to be filled by military personnel from the Participants will be regulated by follow on arrangements, based on detailed "roster", to be issued by the FN.

5.2 Each Participant may detach personnel to the Hellenic OHQ organic structure. Administrative details regarding the detachment of these personnel will be regulated by specific arrangements.

5.3 The legal status that will be applied to personnel of the Participants, while in Greece by virtue of the provisions of this TA, will be regulated by the EU SOFA or any other relevant regulation/ agreement applicable among them. When the "HELBROC BG" is deployed to the Joint Area of Operations, the legal status of the personnel of the Participants will be defined by particular agreements, concluded by the EU and the Nation where the "HELBROC BG" is deployed.

5.4 While performing their official duties, military personnel of the "HELBROC BG" will wear their national military uniforms, together with such distinctive items of uniform (e.g. Flags - Nation Name), as are officially accepted by the U.N. or/ and the EU.

SECTION 6
TRAINING

6.1 The "HELBROC BG" will be employed in training activities, as necessary, following common decisions, in order to achieve the required operational capability.

6.2 The Participants will be responsible for the training of their own units in their permanent locations and in national training facilities, in accordance with established standards.

6.3 Joint training will be conducted according to commonly agreed upon plans and programmes. Key personnel that will participate in the "HELBROC BG" could achieve the required level of expertise through specific courses conducted in the Multinational Peace Support Operations Training Center (MPSOTC), based in Kilis-Greece.

6.4 The necessary arrangements concerning the level and the number of participation to all training activities, together with financial issues will be made at least one month prior to the beginning of the training.

SECTION 7
DOCTRINE, DOCUMENTS AND SECURITY OF INFORMATION

7.1 As a general rule, EU doctrine and publications will constitute the reference documents within the "HELBROC BG" for operational and training activities. In those domains which are not covered by EU conceptual framework, the FN, in close cooperation with the other Participants, will issue all the necessary operational documents.

7.2 EU classified information related to the "HELBROC BG" activities will be protected and handled according to EU regulations. Further details regarding security of information will be incorporated in the "HELBROC BG's" Standing Operating Procedures (SOPs) that will be issued in due course.

7.3 In case of termination or withdrawal from this TA, the provisions related to classified information will remain in effect.

SECTION 8

EMPLOYMENT AND DEPLOYMENT OF THE HELBROC BG

8.1 The Participants will take all necessary measures to take part in "HELBROC BG" operations.

8.2 In case of the "HELBROC BG's" employment within EU-led crisis management operations, the Participants retain the right to deny their contribution, in time, if reasons of national interest arise.

8.3 The availability of "HELBROC BG's" HQs and forces should be assured for any potential operation within the capabilities of the respective BG. Any national caveats must be defined in advance.

8.4 The Contributors must ensure that their national Crisis Management procedures for deploying their military forces abroad will be consistent with the EU BG Concept timeframe.

8.5 Transportation and movement of units, personnel and material from their peacetime locations to the assembly area will be the responsibility of the Contributors. Transportation from the assembly area to the Joint Operations Area (JOA) is the responsibility of the FN.

SECTION 9

LOGISTIC SUPPORT AND COSTS

9.1 Within the "HELBROC BG", the costs regarding force preparation, training and employment of the HELBROC BG will rest upon the Participants unless pertinent EU financial mechanisms are applied.

9.2 Logistic support of the units deployed within the HELBROC BG remains a national responsibility, unless otherwise agreed.

9.3 Each Participant retains the ownership of its own resources.

9.4 Further details regarding logistic support and costs associated with HELBROC's BG activities are described in Annex "C".

SECTION 10

MEDICAL ISSUES

10.1 Personnel pre-identified to deploy within HELBROC's BG-package must have an appropriate level of psychological, medical and physical fitness to operate in austere conditions. A medical programme (including vaccination in accordance with national regulations and the terrain peculiarities) should be tailored – during the preparation phase – to likely areas of deployment.

SECTION 11

POLITICAL—MILITARY CONSULTATIONS

11.1 Representatives of the Participants will attend HELBROC BG meetings, as necessary, to discuss issues of common interest. The duty to convene these meetings is a responsibility of the FN.

11.2 Shortly before and during stand-by periods, the Participants will consult on a regular basis. Particular attention will be given to emerging crises that may result in a request from the EU for deployment of the HELBROC BG, in order to enable parallel decision making and timely response by the Participants' competent authorities.

SECTION 12

ADDITIONAL PARTICIPATION

12.1 Any further application for participation to the HELBROC BG will be examined by the Framework Nation along with the other Participants.

12.2 If such participation is approved, the applicant Nation will accede to this TA, by depositing a Note of Accession (NOA) with the depositary. A sample of this NOA is provided in Annex D'.

SECTION 13

WORKING LANGUAGE

13.1 The working language of the HELBROC BG will be English.

SECTION 14

FINAL PROVISIONS

14.1 This TA will be subject to approval by all Participants in accordance with their national legislation. As soon as it is approved, they will inform the Greek Ministry of Foreign Affairs which will act as depositary. This TA will enter into force on the date that the depositary notifies all Participants that the above mentioned requirement has been fulfilled. It will remain into force until the Participants decide otherwise.

14.2 Any Participant may propose amendments or revision of this TA, in writing, at any time. Any such amendment will enter into force after written approval by all Participants, following the procedure described in para 14.1.


14.3 Without prejudice to the relevant provisions applicable under the EU SOFA or any other relevant regulation/agreement applicable between the Participants, any dispute regarding the interpretation or application of this TA will be resolved by consultation among them and will not be referred to an international or national tribunal or third parties for settlement.

14.4 Either Participant has the right to withdraw from this TA at any time, by providing to the other Participants a withdrawal notice, at least six months prior to the desired withdrawal date. In such a case, this TA will remain into effect for the remaining Participants, until those Participants decide otherwise. Notice of withdrawal from the FN means the termination of this TA.

14.5 The present TA is drawn up in one original in the English language, and will be deposited with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Hellenic Republic. The depositary will provide certified copies to each Participant.



ANNEX "A" to the Technical Agreement

DEFINITIONS

Assembly Area: The area in which the HELBROC BG will be assembled in preparation to deploy for an EU Operation. The definition of the assembly area is a responsibility of the Operation Commander.

Contributors: Participants providing their commitment to a specific exercise or operation.

Framework Nation (FN): The Hellenic Republic.

Force Headquarters (FHQ): The headquarters of an EU force deployed to the area of operations.

HELBROC BG activities: The activities under this TA performed by HELBROC BG personnel and/or units, prior to deployment, including training and exercises, during and after deployment for operations.

HELBROC BG Personnel: Appropriate personnel, who a Participant decides to earmark for the HELBROC BG.

HELBROC BG Unit/ Detachment: a unit/ detachment that a Participant decides to earmark for the HELBROC BG.

Joint Operations Area: A temporary area, in which the HELBROC BG is deployed to execute a specific mission. The definition of the joint operations area and its relevant parameters, such as time, scope of the mission and geographical area is a responsibility of the Operation Commander.

Operation Commander (OpCdr): A Commander outside the area of operations nominated by the EU Council to conduct a defined operation and authorised to exercise operational command or operational control over allocated forces.

Operation Headquarters (OHQ): The static, out-of-area headquarters of the Operation Commander, which is responsible for building up, launching, sustaining and recovering an EU-led force.

Operational Command: The authority granted to a Commander to assign missions or tasks to subordinate Commanders, to deploy units, to reassign forces, and to retain or delegate operational and/or tactical control as the Commander deems necessary. It does not of itself include responsibility for administration or logistics. May also be used to denote the forces assigned to a Commander.

Operational Control: The authority delegated to a Commander to direct forces assigned so that the Commander may accomplish specific missions or tasks which are usually limited by function, time or location; to deploy units concerned, and to retain or assign tactical control of those units. It does not include authority to assign separate employment or components of these units concerned. Neither does it, of itself, include administrative or logistic control.

Participants: Ministries of Defense of Bulgaria, Cyprus, Greece and Romania and of any other that may accede to this TA in the future.

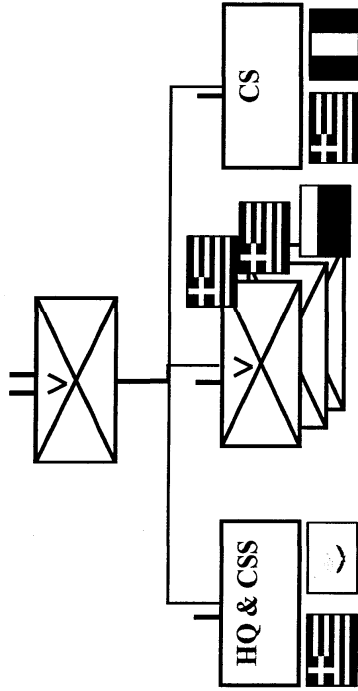
Tactical Command: The authority delegated to a Commander to assign tasks to forces under his command for the accomplishment of the missions assigned by a higher authority.

Tactical Control: The detailed, and usually, local direction and control of movements or manoeuvres necessary to accomplish missions or tasks assigned.

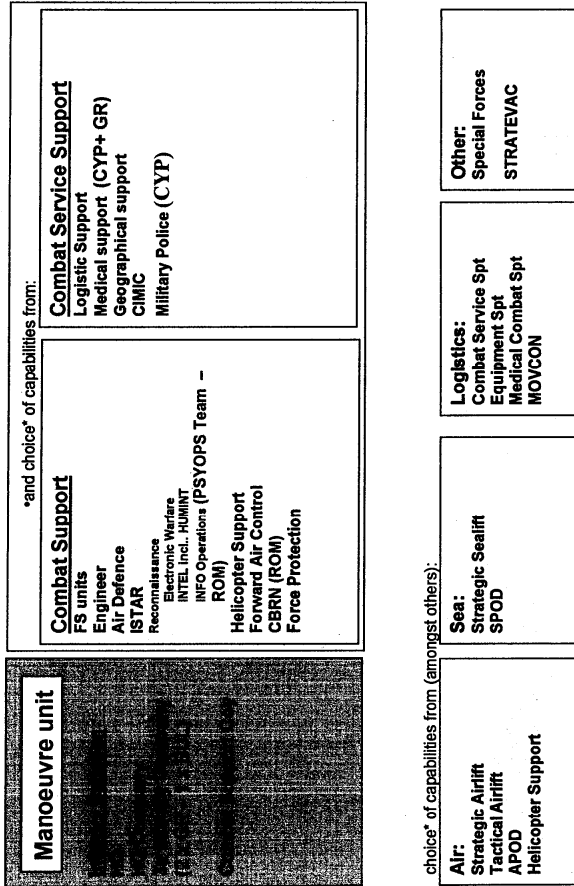
Transfer of Authority: An action by which national authorities of a Contributor officially give operational control of designated national forces to the Operation Commander.

ANNEX "C" to the Technical Agreement

LOGISTIC SUPPORT AND COSTS

SECTION ONE

General Principles of Logistic Support

- 1.1 Each Contributor remains responsible for the logistic support of its Forces.
- 1.2 The transportation of forces to the assembly area will be implemented with concern and responsibility of the Contributors.
- 1.3 Starting the next day of their arrival in the assembly area, and up to the day of departure to the JOA, logistic support for personnel will be provided with concern and responsibility of the FN. The cost of this support will be determined by the FN and will be charged to the Contributors in accordance with the total number of their personnel within "HELBROC BG". For the same period, logistic support for the equipment and materials will be provided by the Contributor.
- 1.4 In accordance with the "EU BG Concept", the forces that will participate in the BG should be initially self-sustained for 30 days in munitions, materials and spare - parts and moreover reserves should exist in their home locations for 90 more days, with concern of Contributors.
- 1.5 Further support and supply of the "HELBROC BG" will be established, if it is required, via line of supply that will be organized by the FN.
- 1.6 The logistic support of "HELBROC BG", may be facilitated by the use of local organizations/companies or possible Host Nation Support. This support will be provided via agreements concluded with concern of the FN.
- 1.7 The existing National Support Elements will be under the administration of the FHQ.
- 1.8 The maintenance of materials and means remains National responsibility. Relative reciprocal assistance can be provided depending on the availability of means and the possibilities on the spot, under the co-ordination of Force Commander (FCdr). The reciprocal assistance will be reimbursed to the provider, according to the cost of the service.
- 1.9 Role 1 medical support will be provided with national concern and responsibility of Contributors. Role 2 medical support will be provided by the FN with the cost to be reimbursed by the Contributors, depending on the provided services to their personnel.
- 1.10 Strategic aero-medical evacuation is a national responsibility. In-theater evacuation will be provided by the means of the FN with the cost to be reimbursed by the Contributor concerned.

SECTION TWO

Transport of HELBROC BG in JOA

- 2.1 The transportation of forces from the Assembly area to the Joint Operations Area will be the responsibility of the FN.
- 2.2 The cost for the transportation will be charged to the Contributors, according to the volume and weight of transported materials, equipment, supplies, personnel etc.

2.3 The plans of transportation are a responsibility of the OHQ, FHQ assisted by the Liaison Officers of the Contributors.

SECTION THREE

Logistic Support after HELBROC BG Deployment

3.1 After the deployment of HELBROC BG a line of supply will be established and maintained by the FN and could be used by the Contributors. The Point of Embarkation of Line of Supply will be predetermined in time by the FN and will be notified to the Contributors.

3.2 The Contributors will be responsible for the in time arrival of materials that will be transported to the predefined Point of Embarkation of the Line of Supply. In case the Point of Arrival is different from the Point of Embarkation, the intermediary logistic services will be executed with concern of the FN and the cost of these services will be reimbursed by the Contributors.

3.3 The cost for the use of the Line of Supply and the allocation of the cost will be determined by the FN. The Contributors using the Line of Supply will pay to the FN the cost that is related to the logistic services provided.

3.4 Contracting that is eventually required for the logistic support of "HELBROC BG" with local contractors or with friendly nearby Nation, will be responsibility of the FN, which will act on behalf of the whole force.

3.5 The cost of the common services and its payment will be calculated by the FN. It will be based on percentage participation and objective criteria, accepted by the Contributors.

3.6 Logistic support concerning catering services – rations and supply of petroleum, oil and lubricants (POL), will be provided to the Contributors by the FN upon request, in the same way/level as for its own Forces. The Contributors will reimburse the cost of this service.

3.7 The Contributors will be responsible for the financial support of their forces.

3.8 Postal services will be provided to the Contributors by the FN, via the Line of Supply. Further distribution, from Greece to destination countries will be a responsibility of the FN, at the expenses of the Contributors the service is provided for.
